

Throughout his 23 year career with Fire Services in Markham, Oshawa, and Whitby, Dave has held multiple positions, including his current role as Whitby's Fire Chief and CEMC. In 2014, Chief Speed was part of a multi-agency team that worked together to see all 192 occupants safely evacuated during a large fire at Fairview Lodge. Learn what role you or your group may play in a large scale emergency. You may be surprised.









Warren Leonard

Warren Leonard is the Director of the Emergency Management Office for the Regional Municipality of Durham. Reporting to the CAO he is responsible for providing the direction and coordination of municipal risk assessment, mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery activities for the Region of Durham, home to a population of 656,000 residents covering 2,537 sq. km and 8 local municipalities. As a practitioner of emergency management for the past 33 years, Warren has been directly involved in all facets of emergency management including, public education, planning, training and exercises, as well as operational response to major emergencies such as the Ice Storm 1998, SARS 2003, Blackout 2003, propane explosion 2008, H1N1 outbreak 2009, and served as the Emergency Operations Centre Director for the G20 Summit in 2010. Prior to his

current position with Durham Region, Warren was a Manager at the City of Toronto's Office of Emergency Management for 11 years. He began his public safety career as a 911 dispatcher for the Toronto Police Service for 3 years, before being promoted to manage the police Emergency Management section of the Public Safety Unit for 14 years, responding to hazardous materials incidents, missing person searches, public order occurrences, and a host of major special events regularly held in Toronto. As a founding Director of the Ontario Association of Emergency Managers he helped establish an association of emergency management professionals. Warren served two terms as a Certification Commissioner for the International Association of Emergency Managers.
